Cleaning Stethoscope

Purpose

The purpose of this procedure is to prevent cross contamination when using a stethoscope between residents and/or when a stethoscope is used by multiple staff members.

Equipment and Supplies

The following equipment and supplies will be necessary when performing this procedure.

- 1. Stethoscope:
- 2. Alcohol wipes; and
- 3. Personal protective equipment (e.g., gowns, gloves, mask, etc., as needed).

Steps in the Procedure

In the absence of the manufacturer's specific care and maintenance instructions, clean the stethoscope using the following procedures:

- 1. Arrange the supplies so they can be easily reached.
- 2. Wash and dry your hands thoroughly.
- 3. Put on clean gloves.
- 4. Examine stethoscope for damages. Report damaged equipment to your supervisor.
- 5. Using firm pressure, clean stethoscope ear pieces, tubing, diaphragm and bell in a circular motion.
- 6. Remove gloves and discard into designated container. Wash and dry your hands thoroughly.
- 7. Return the stethoscope to its designated storage area.
- 8. Discard disposable equipment and supplies in designated containers.
- 9. Clean and disinfect the surface area used to clean the stethoscope.
- 10. Wash and dry your hands thoroughly.
